### Town Adopts Donations Review and Acceptance Policy

The Town Council recently approved a new Donations Review and Acceptance Policy to provide clear guidance on how Shepherdstown reviews, approves, and records all gifts and contributions.

The policy applies to both monetary and in-kind donations made to the Town and its committees—ensuring consistency, transparency, and alignment with community values. The Town Council review will include an analysis of the long-term costs to the Town for maintenance of any donated property and for any offers to redesign or improve Town property.

All approved gifts will be recorded for public record, including their purpose and donor information.

The Town extends sincere appreciation to all individuals and organizations whose generosity enhances the quality of life and services in Shepherdstown.

## **Building Commission Lands New Members**



The Municipal Building Commission has been authorized in town ordinances for many years, but the Commission had been dormant and without appointed commissioners. However, the Town Council appointed three members to that commission at the November 2025 meeting: Elise Bach, Andrew Singletary, and Stephen Skinner.

The Commission is authorized to oversee the acquisition, maintenance, and operation of public buildings, facilities, and property. Members serve five-year terms without compensation, and must be residents of the Corporation of Shepherdstown. <u>Click here</u> to find out more.

### **Tree Commission Report**

The Tree Commission reviewed an extensive list of ongoing tree actions, noting several locations with pending work and others that have recently progressed, including approved maintenance bids and completed fall treatments.

The sugar maple recently removed at Town Hall prompted discussion about installing a small knee wall with a root barrier, with plans to prepare materials for Historic Landmarks before seeking bids.

At 112 W. German St., the Commission evaluated options to enlarge the existing concrete tree well to improve doorway clearance, with site measurements and sidewalk assessments underway.

Commission Members also discussed new planting opportunities, which includes the area on W. High St. (west of Duke) and at key town entry points.

Additional updates covered stump grinding on W. German St. and New St., coordination challenges at a grading-problem site, and a recent pruning request at E. High St.

New business included evaluating a possibly dead tree on Old Queen Alley, setting guidance for decorations on the historic Market House crabapple tree, and noting the removal of a storm-damaged tree at Rocky and High Streets.

## **Town Selects Historic Preservation Intern**

The Town of is pleased to announce that Shepherd University senior Tabatha C. Delphi has been selected as the first participant in the new Shepherdstown Historic Preservation Internship, a partnership between the Town and Shepherd University designed to support local preservation work and provide real-world experience for students.

The internship will assist the Shepherdstown Historic Landmarks Commission (HLC) with projects that document and protect the Town's historic district. As part of her role, Delphi will help update the Town's historic database, expand public access to preservation information, and develop resources for residents, realtors and business owners.

### "Almost Heaven" Swing Now Open at Rumsey Monument Park

Shepherdstown celebrated a joyful Dedication & Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on Saturday, November 29, marking the official opening of the new "Almost Heaven" West Virginia Swing at Rumsey Monument Park. The project was a partnership between the Rotary Club of Shepherdstown and the



Town. The swing is now a permanent Town-owned feature in one of our most scenic public spaces.

The idea first came to the Rotary Club from Karrington Childress, Miss West Virginia 2023, who noted that—despite all the "Almost Heaven" swings across the state—none were located in Berkeley or Jefferson Counties. She identified the overlook at Rumsey Monument Park as a perfect location, and Rotary immediately stepped in to help make it happen.

Working with the Nicholas County Career and Technical Center and the West Virginia Department of Tourism, Rotary secured the swing and selfie-sign components through the state's Cooperative Advertising Program, funded the materials, and coordinated the build. The Town provided the installation site, park access, and will maintain the swing going forward.

Rumsey Monument Park is among our Town's most cherished and historic parks. Overlooking the Potomac River, the park marks the site of James Rumsey's groundbreaking 1787 steamboat trial, honored today by the 75-foot monument erected in 1915. Adding the swing gives people yet another reason to visit—offering a peaceful spot to rest, enjoy the view, and experience a little slice of West Virginia's natural beauty.

To visit the swing, head into town via WV-480/Duke Street, turn east onto High Street, then left onto Mill Street, and follow Rumsey Monument Road up the hill. Free weekend parking is available on Mill Street, with limited parking at the park. Make a point to enjoy this special new addition to our community!
